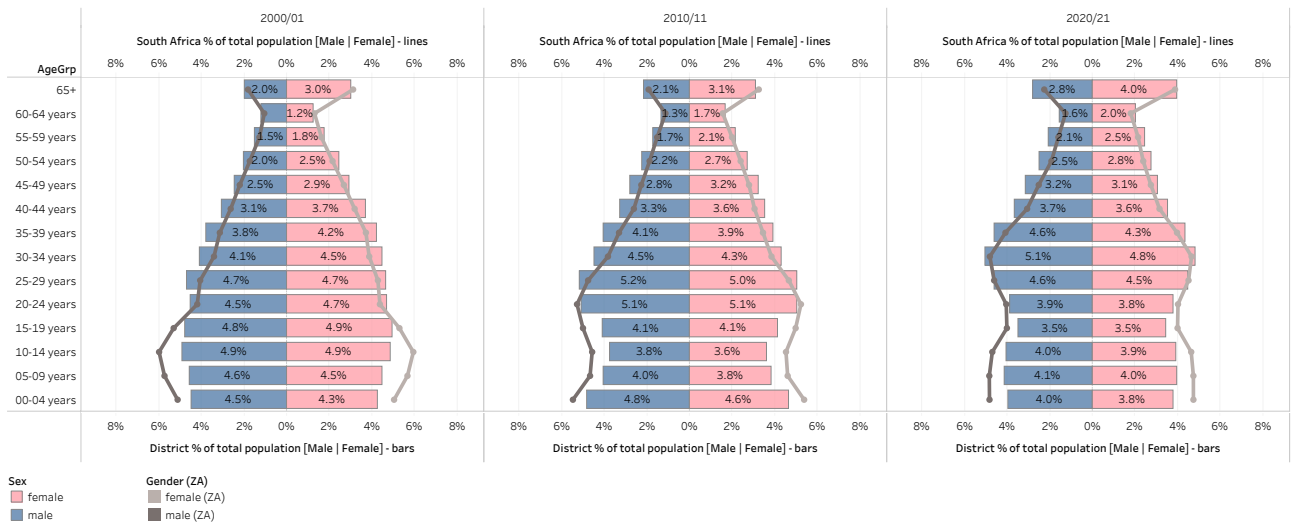

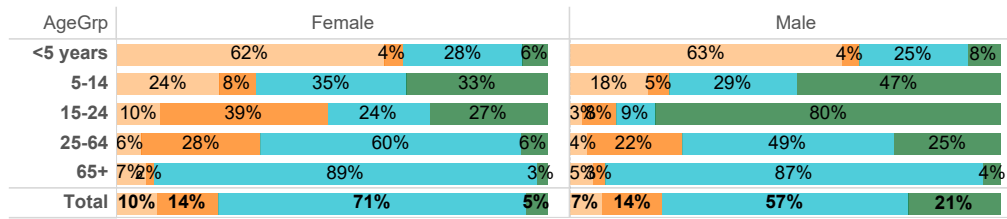

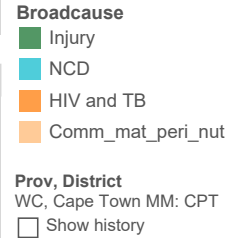

Percentage of deaths by broad cause and leading causes, 2012–2017

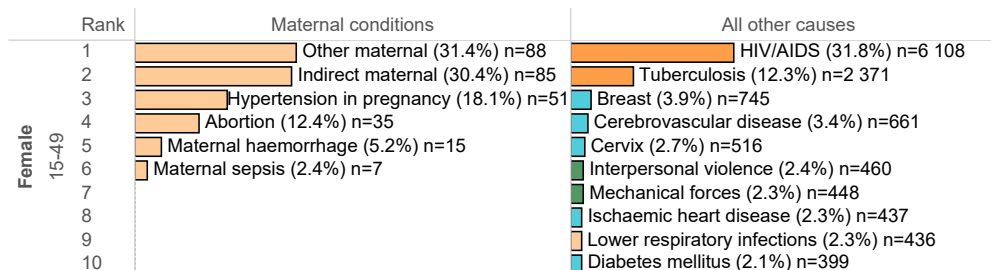
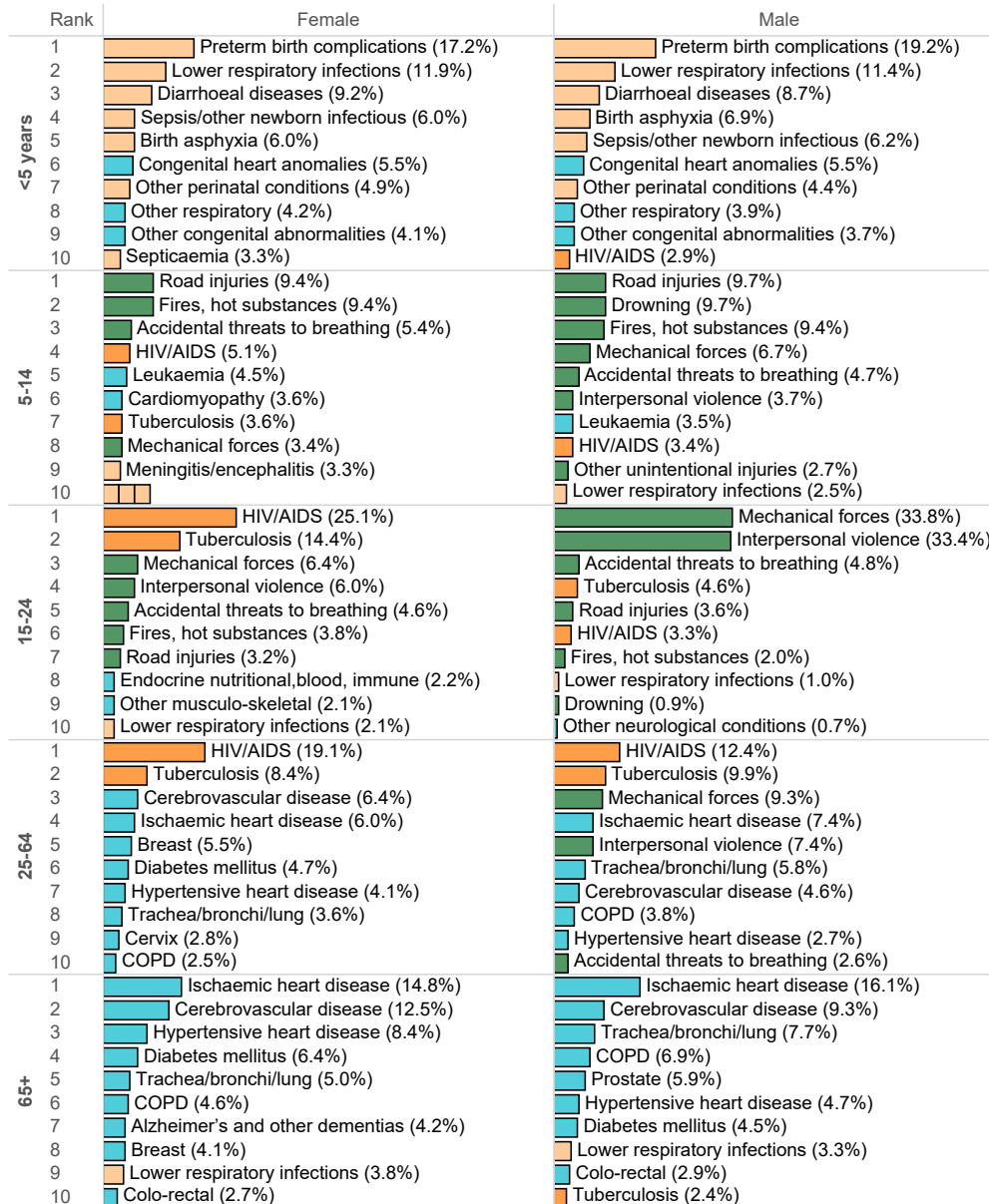

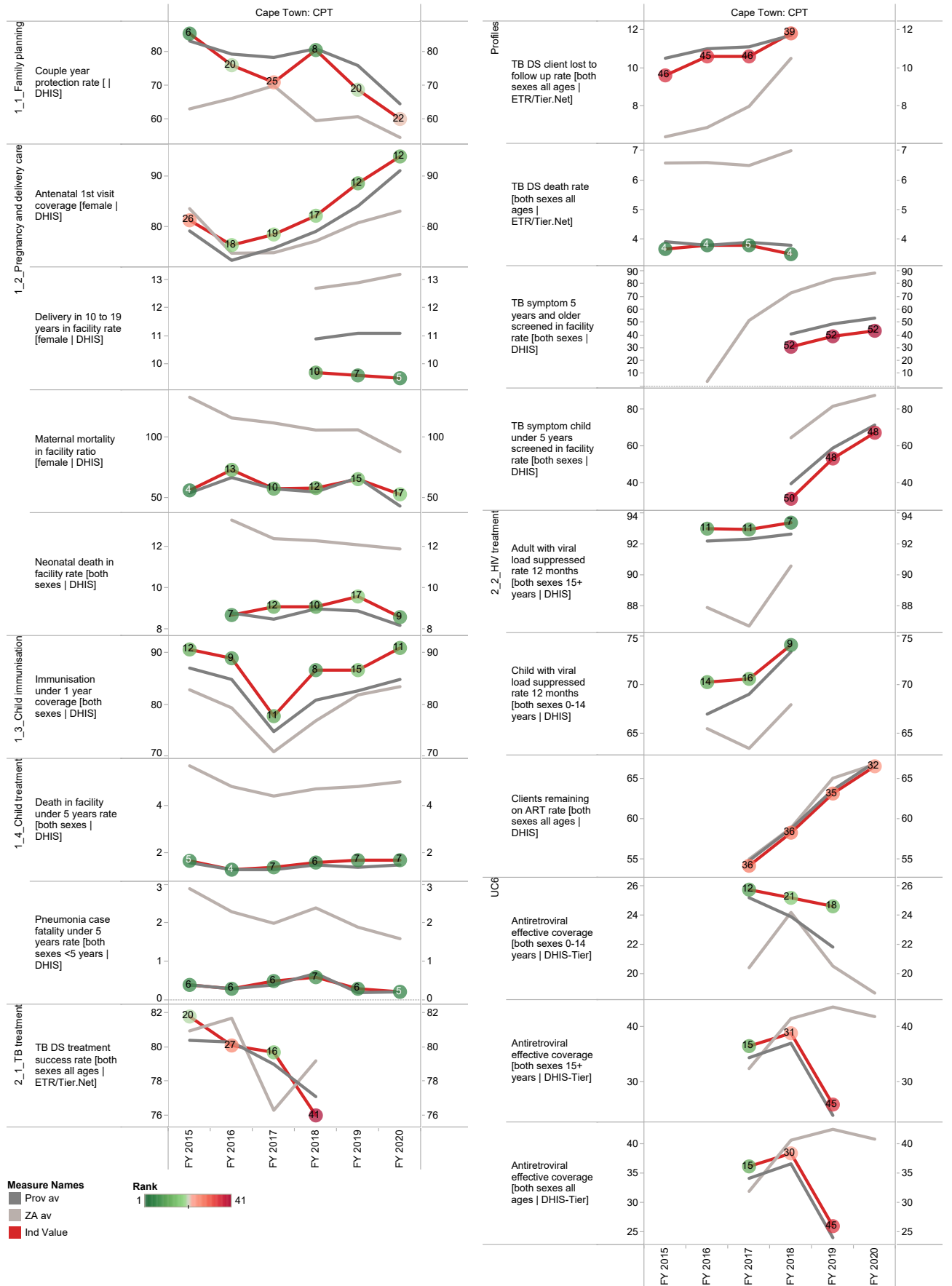
Percentage of deaths by broad causes and single leading causes



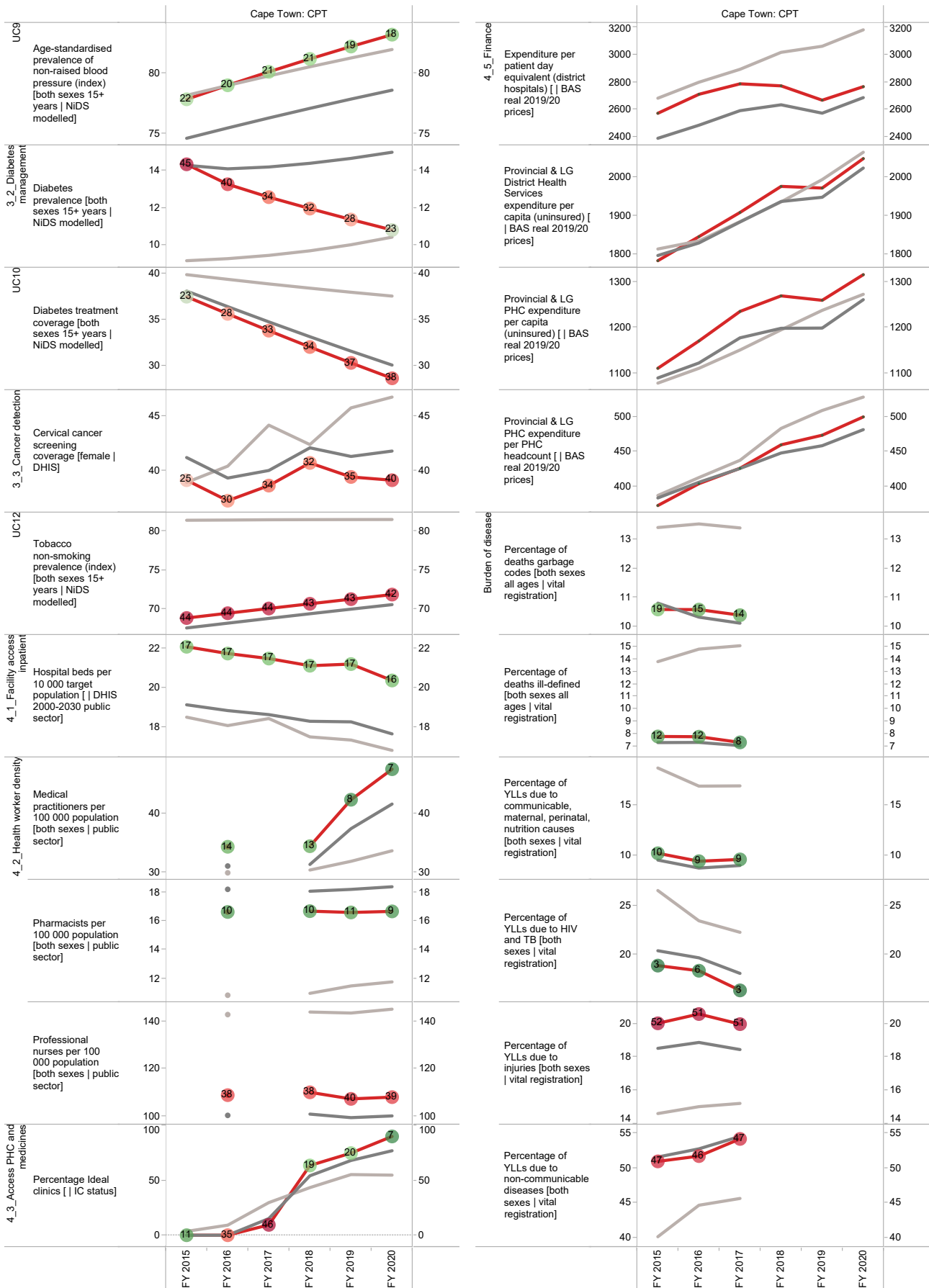

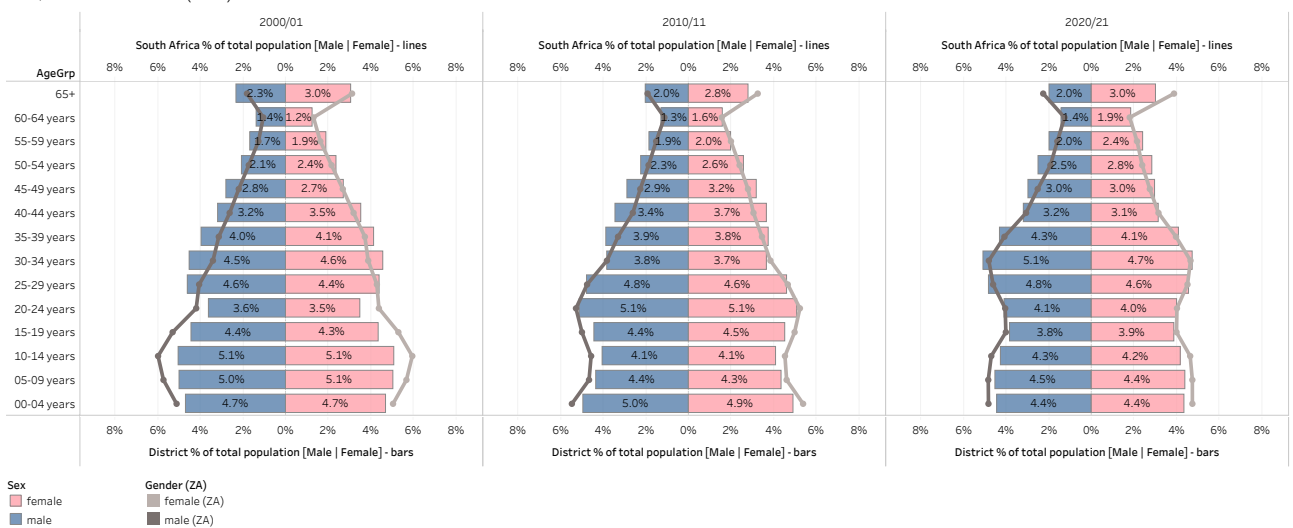

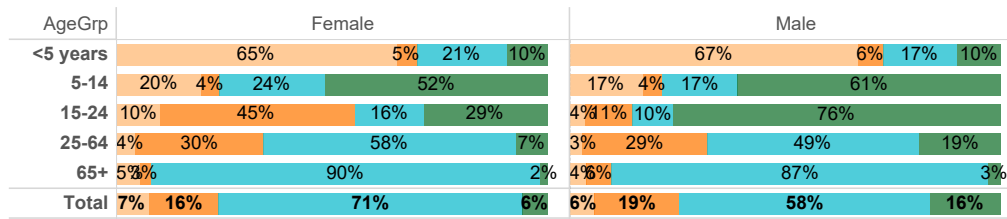

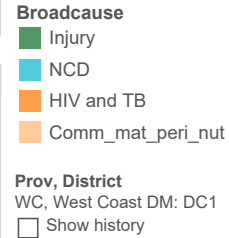

Percentage of deaths by broad cause and leading causes, 2012–2017

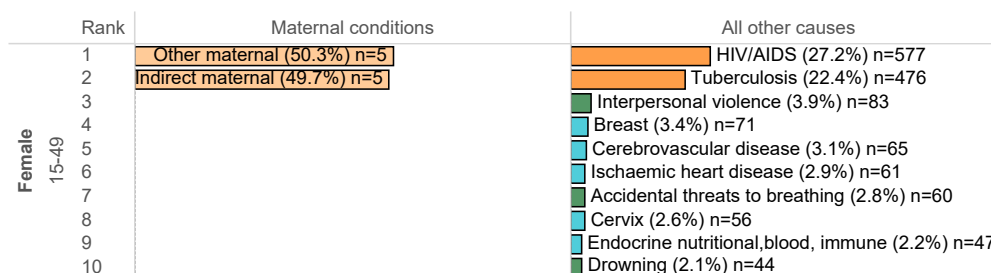
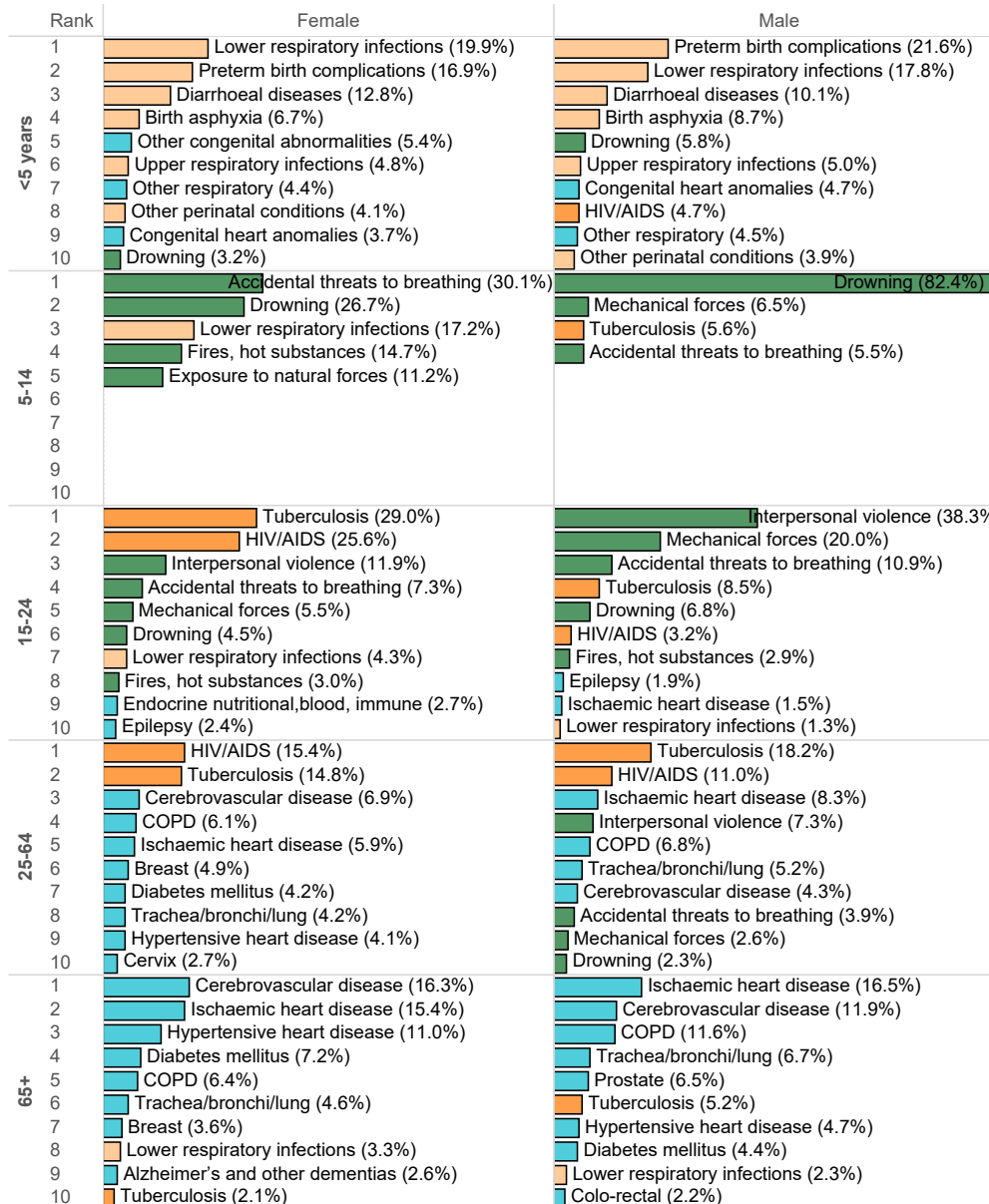
WC, West Coast DM: DC1, 2012 - 2017



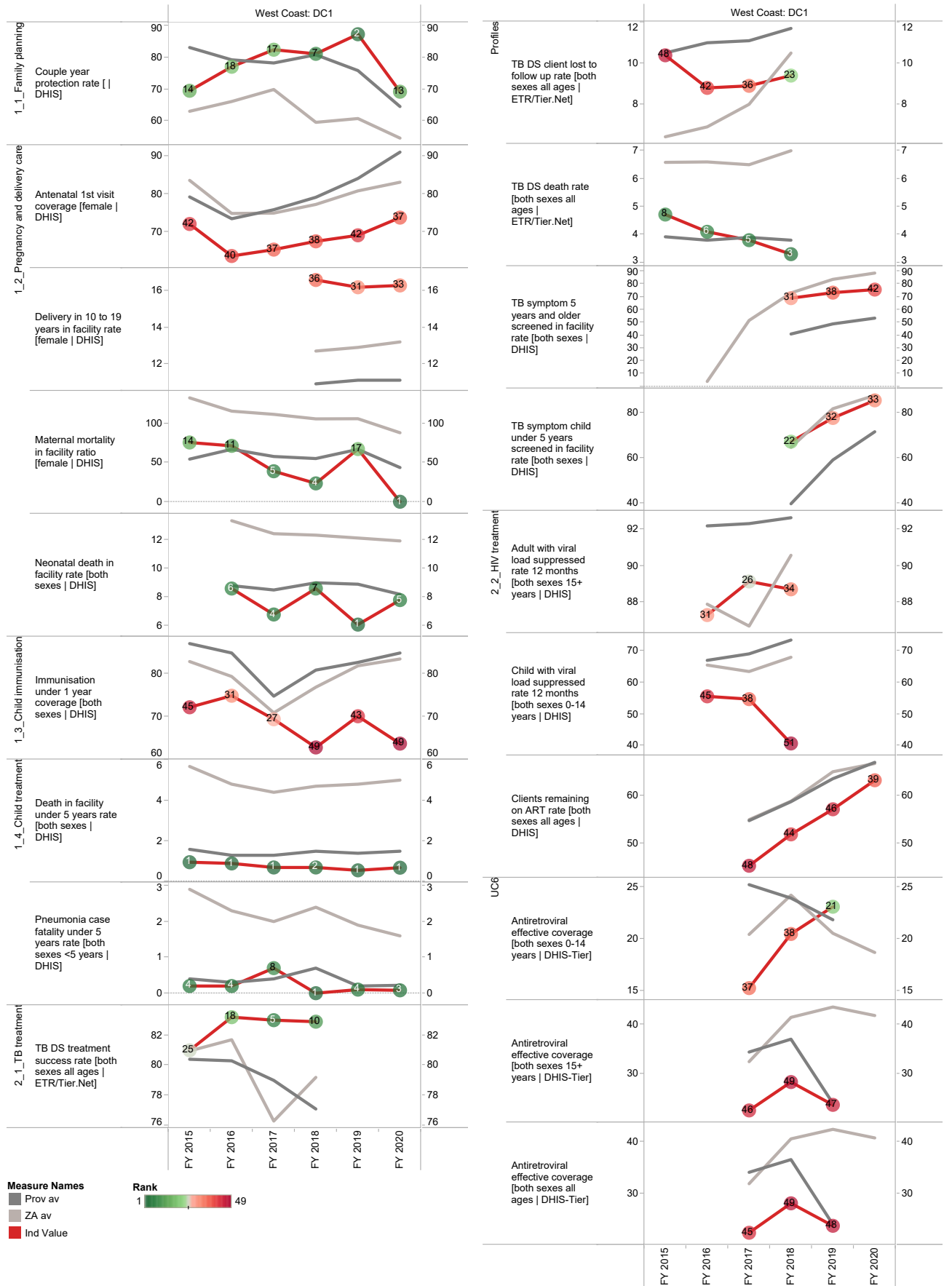
Percentage of deaths by broad causes and single leading causes



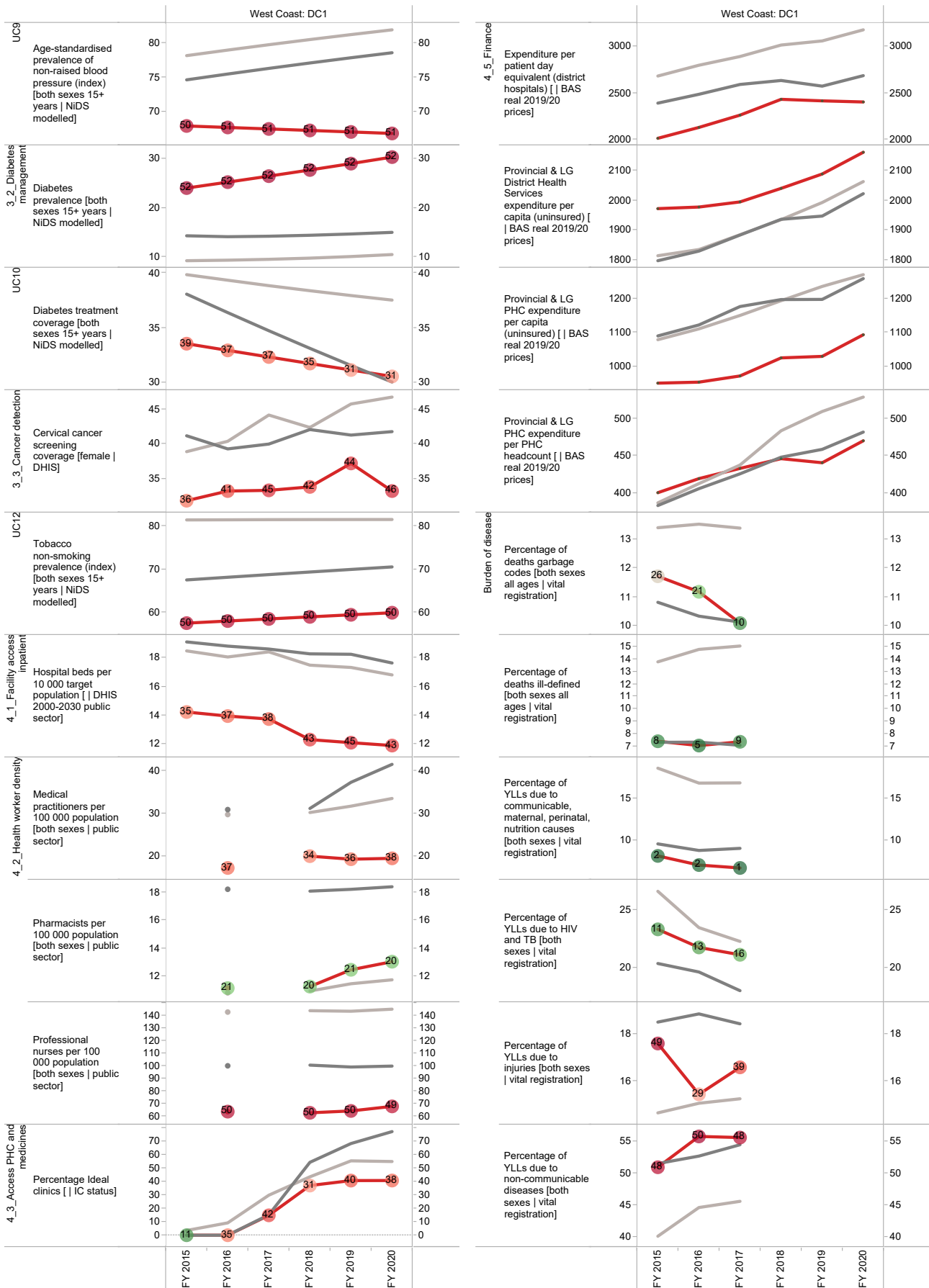

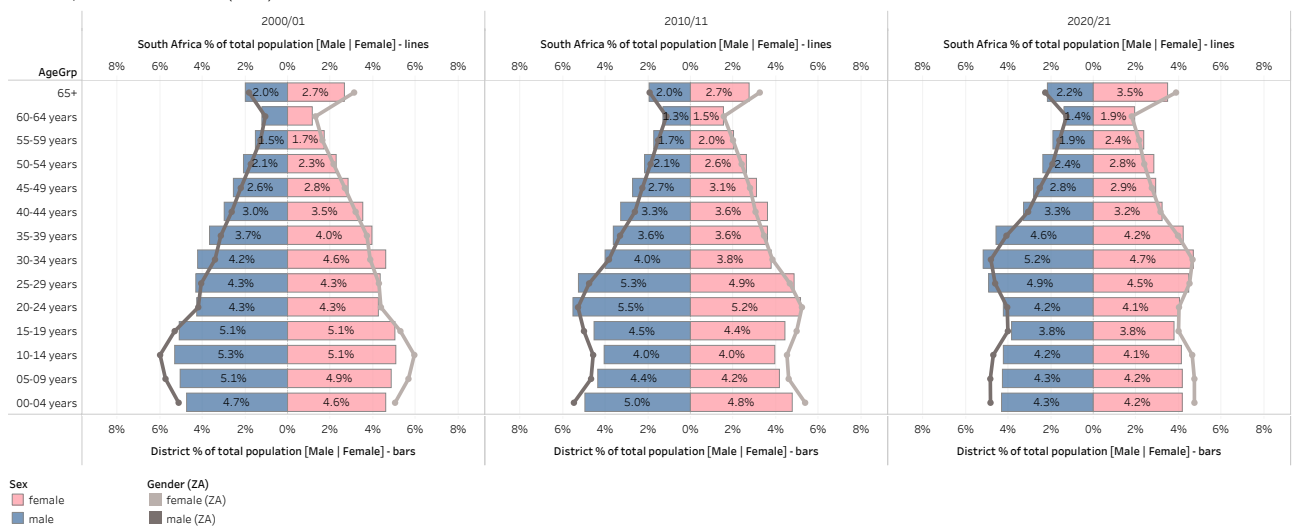

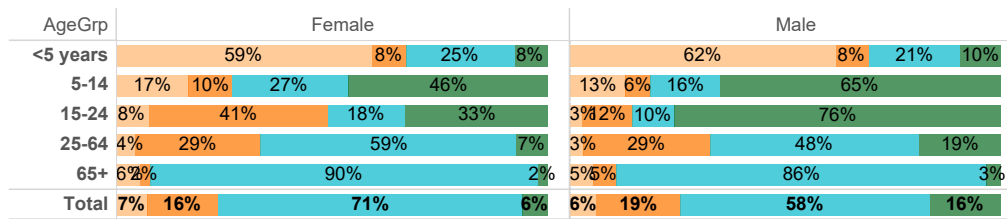

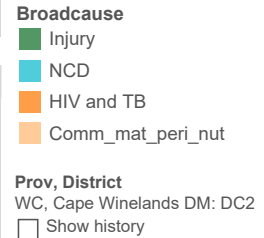

Percentage of deaths by broad cause and leading causes, 2012–2017

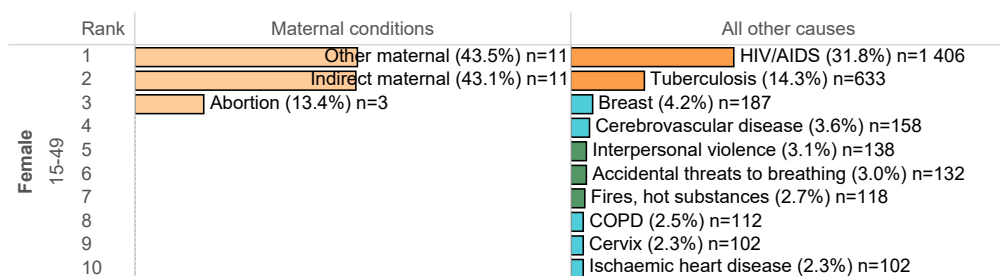
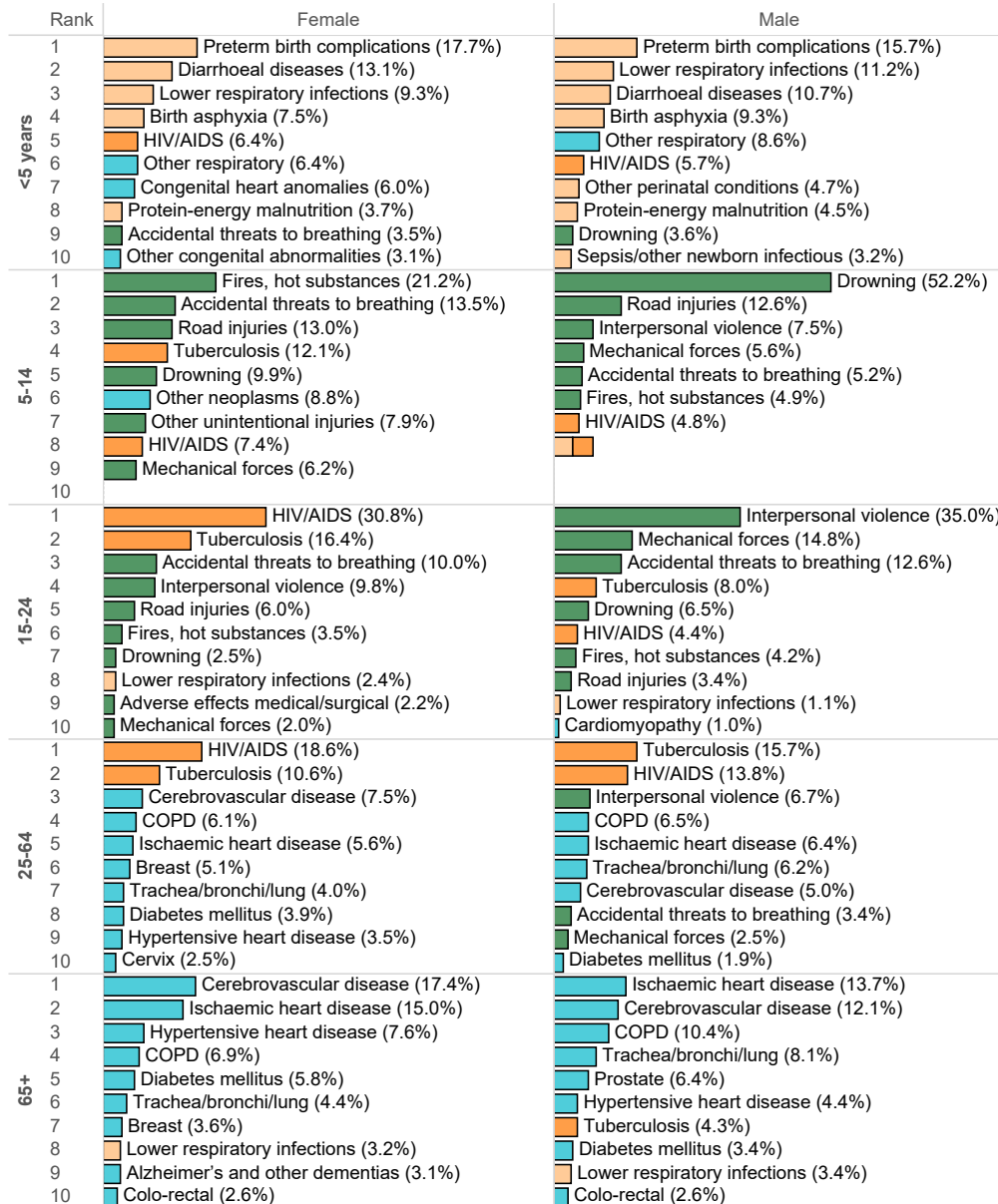
WC, Cape Winelands DM: DC2, 2012 - 2017



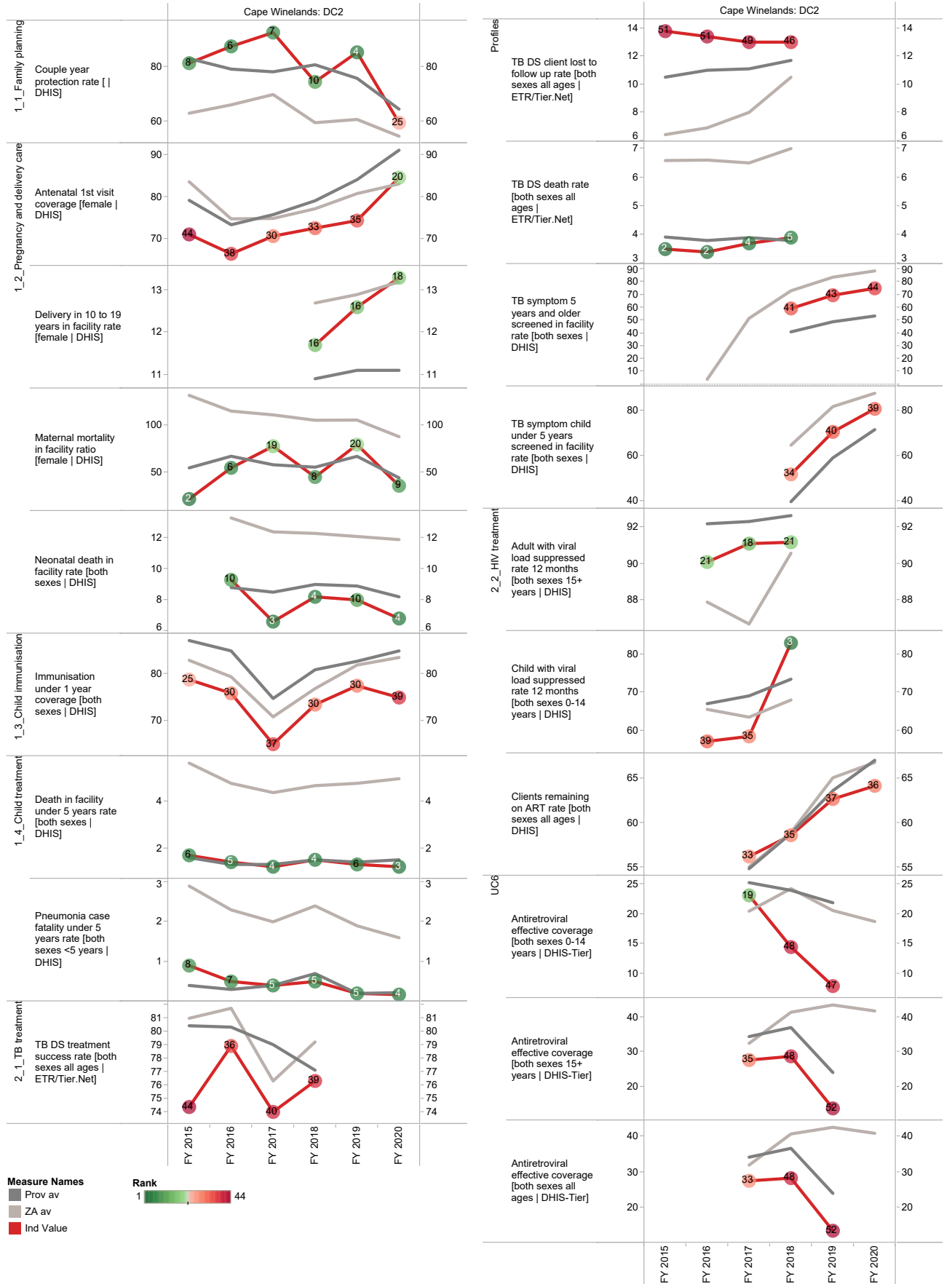
Percentage of deaths by broad causes and single leading causes



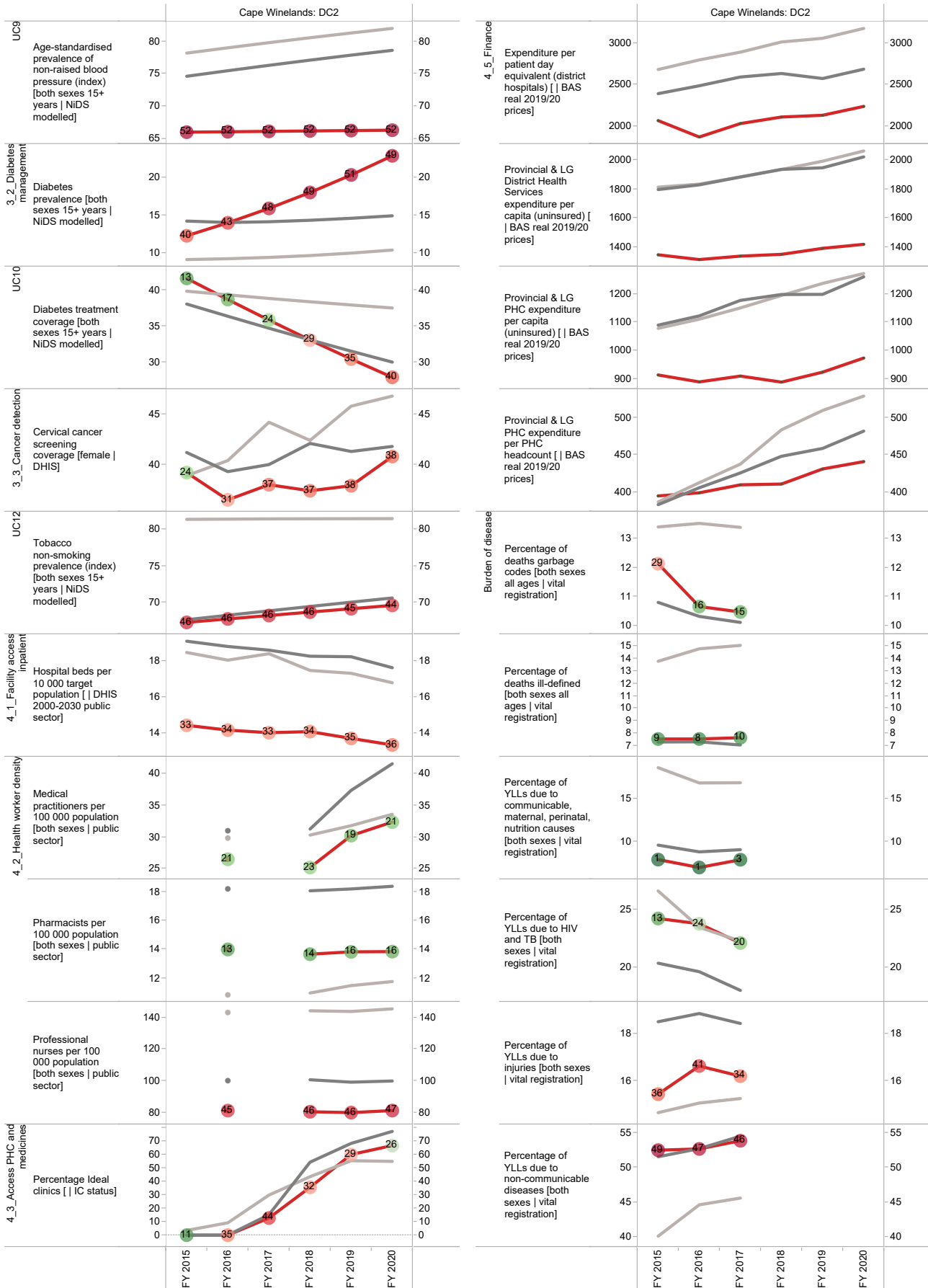

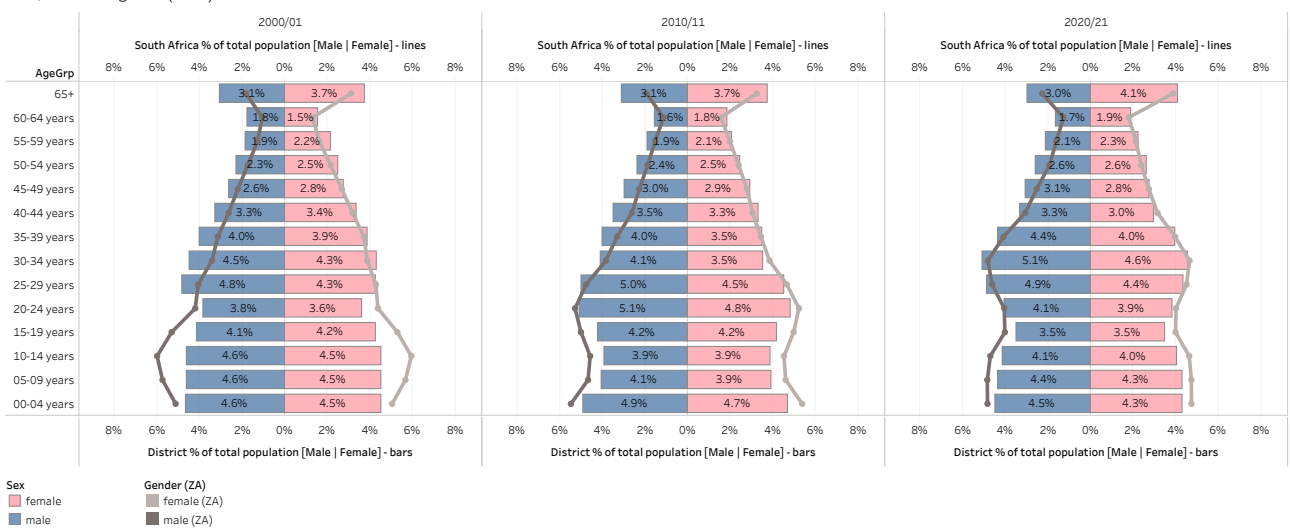

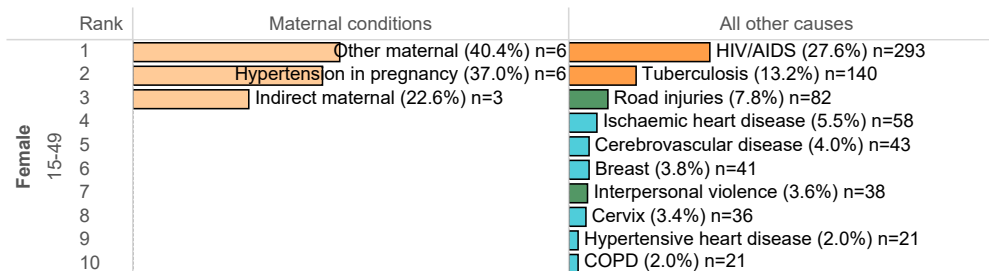
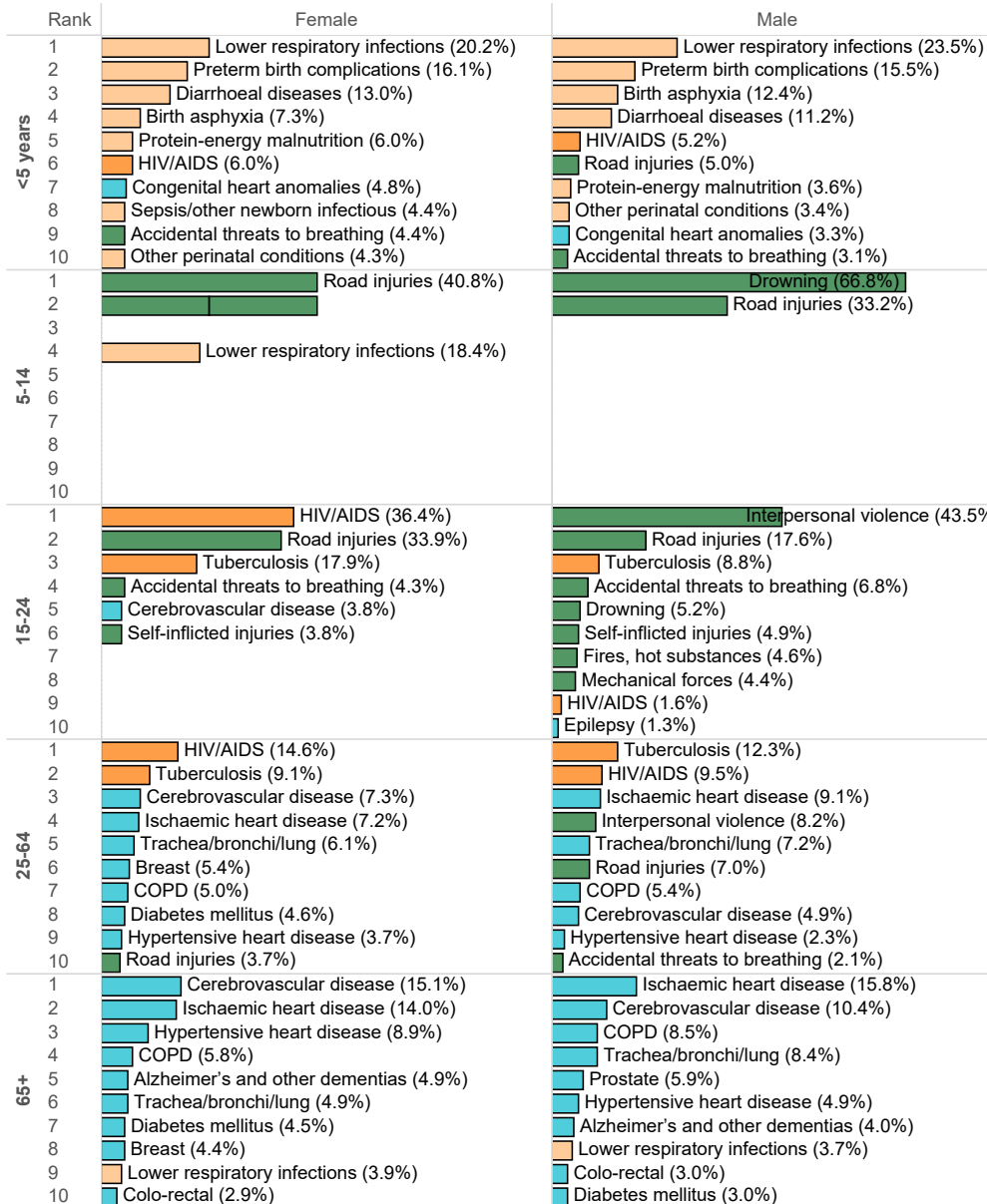
Percentage of deaths by broad cause and leading causes, 2012–2017

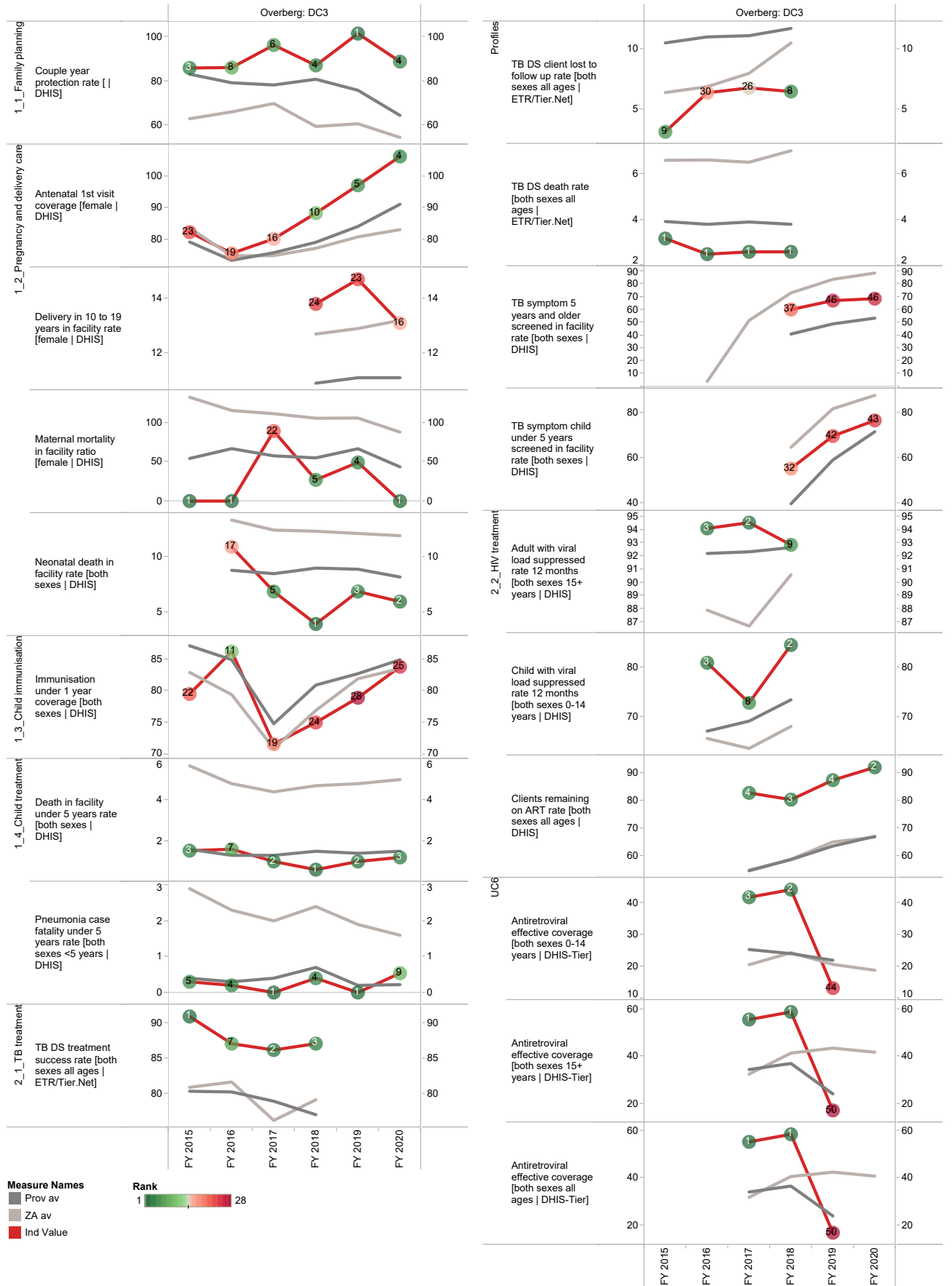
Percentage of deaths by broad causes and single leading causes



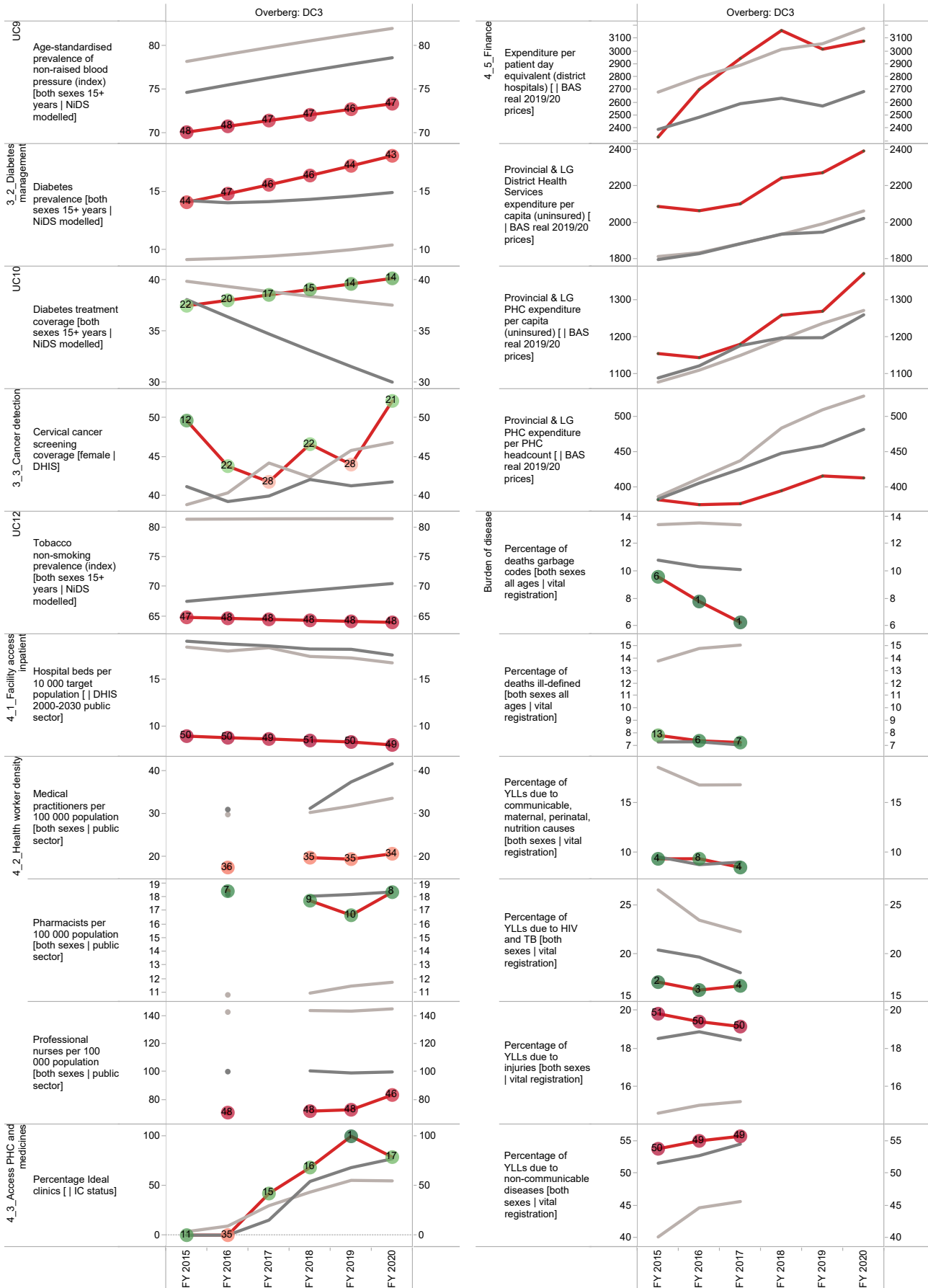

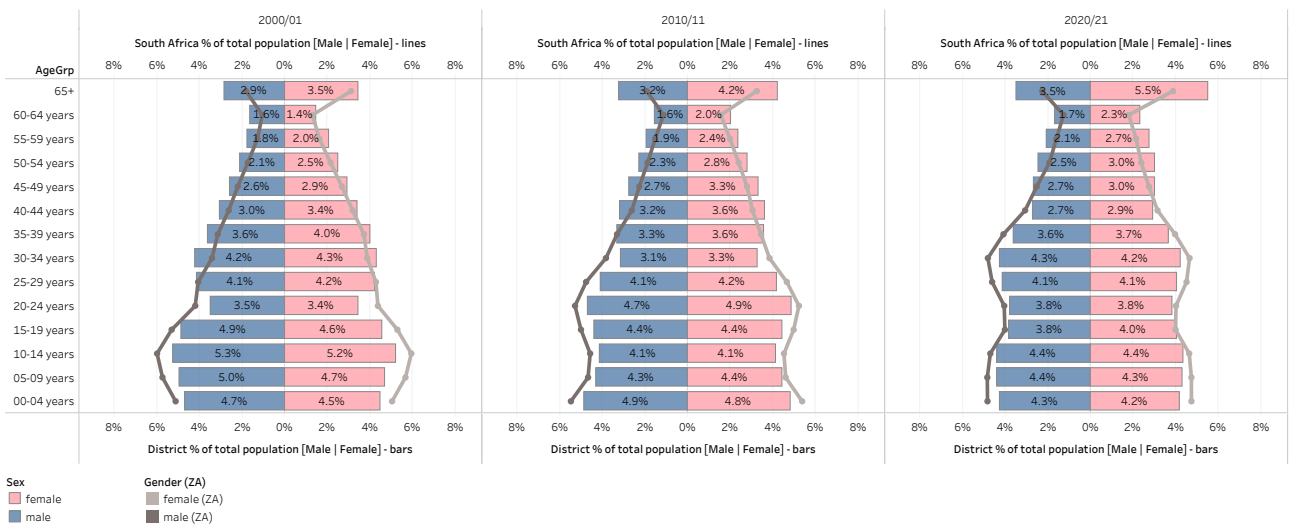

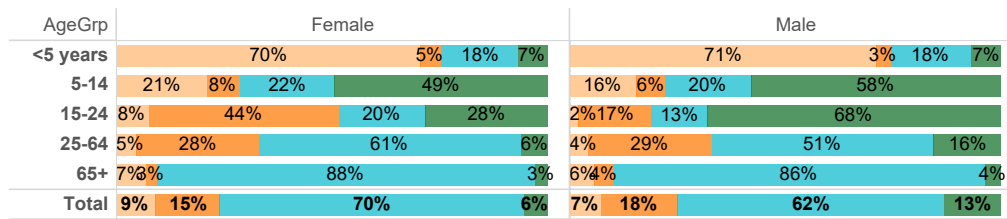

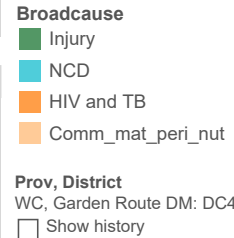

Percentage of deaths by broad cause and leading causes, 2012–2017

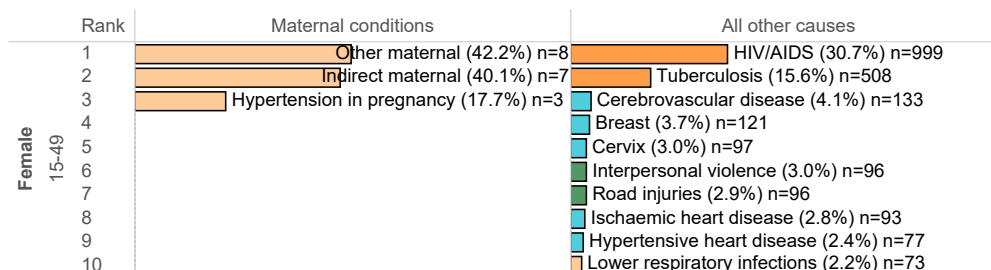
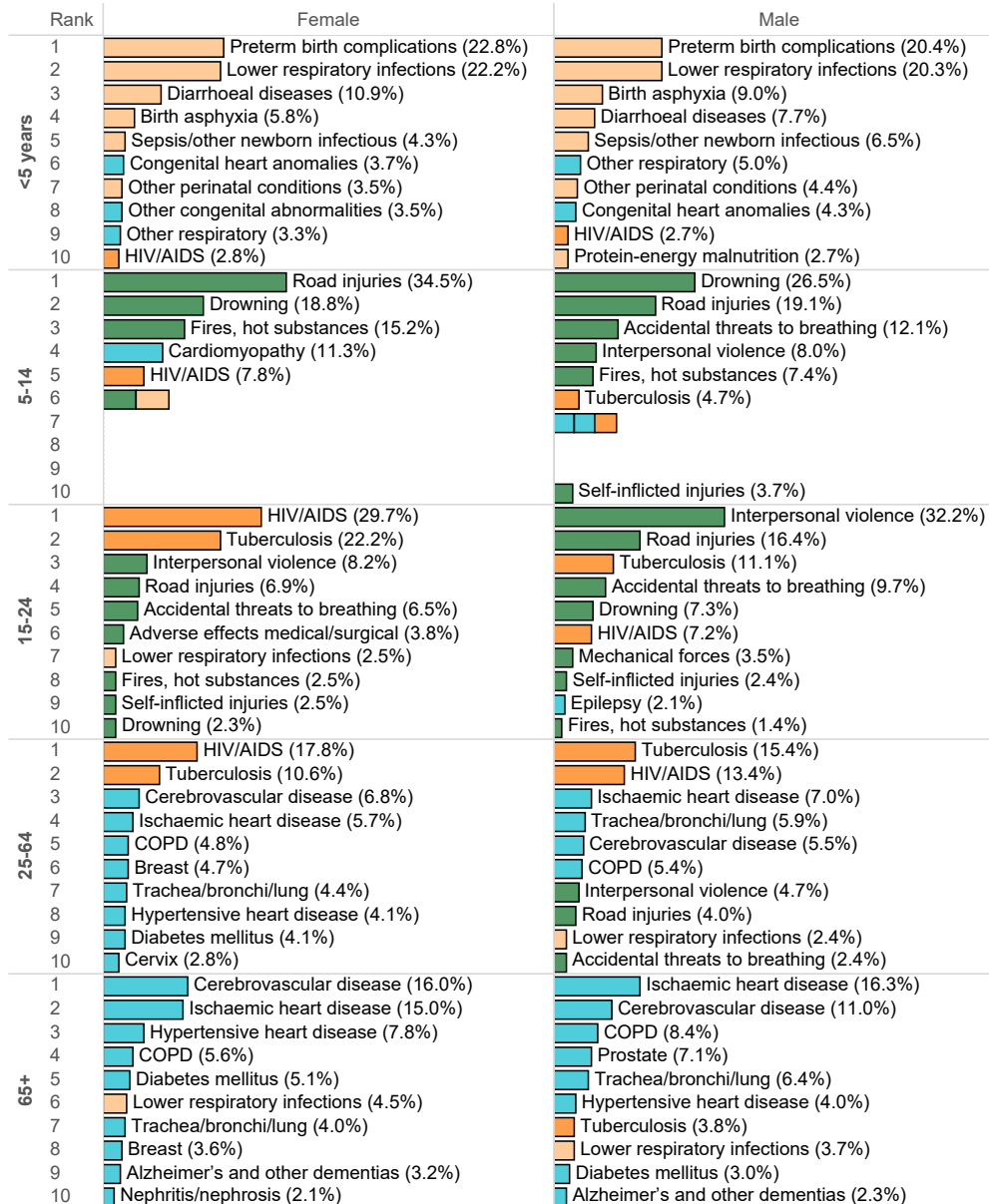

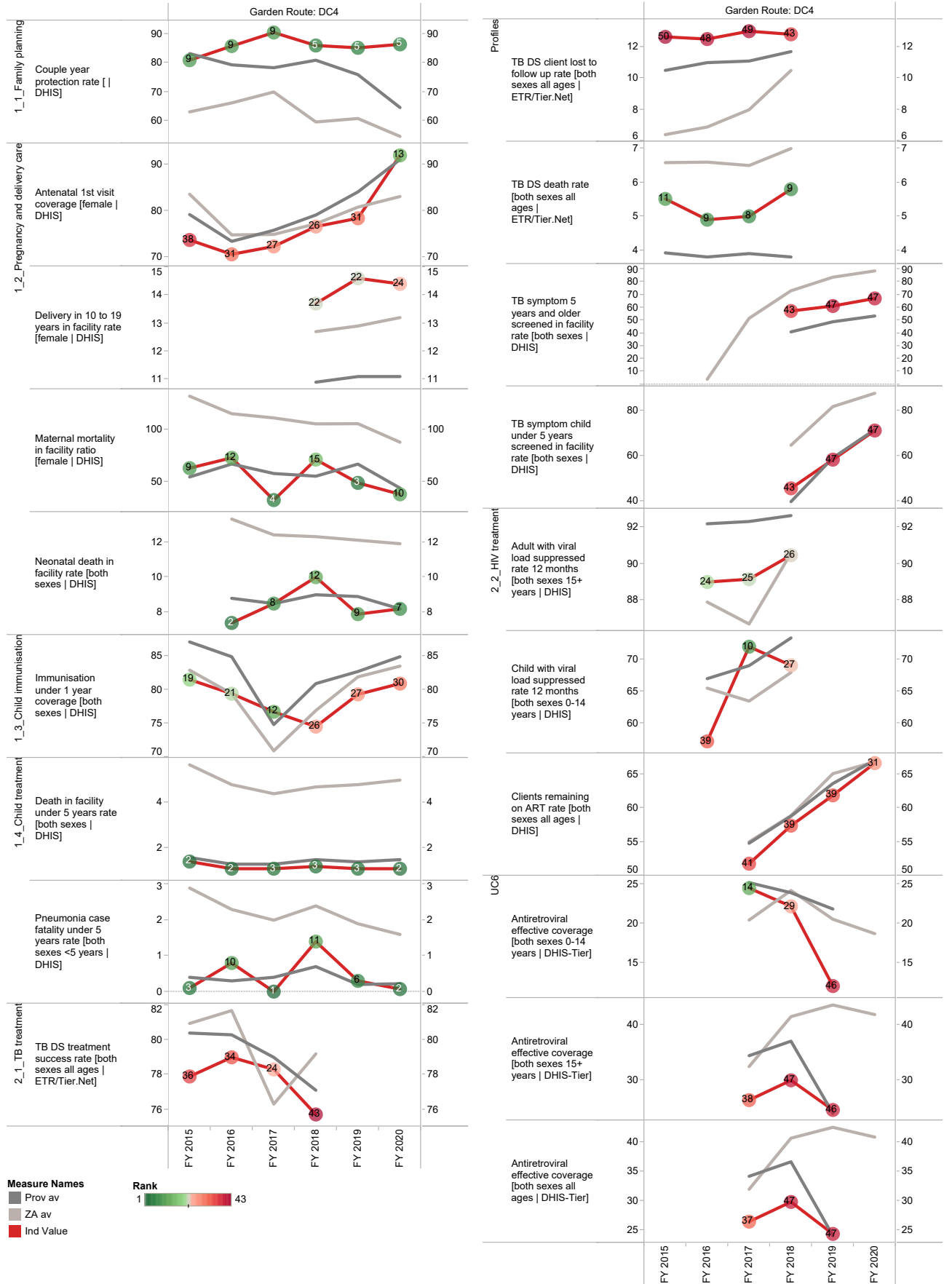
Percentage of deaths by broad causes and single leading causes

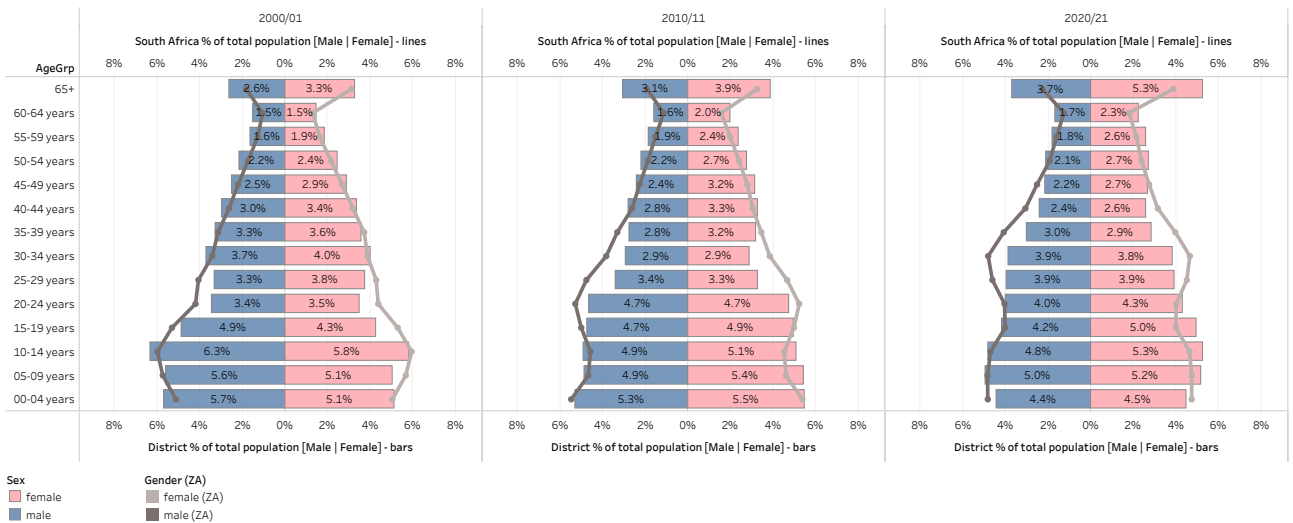

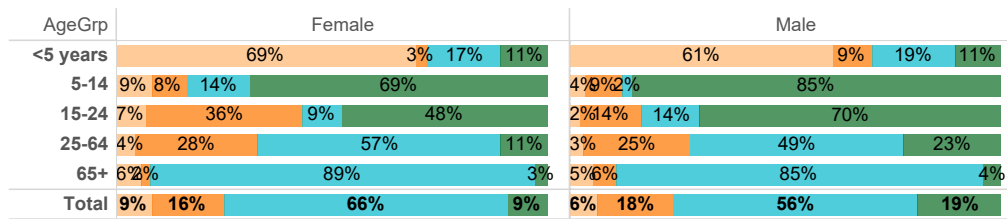

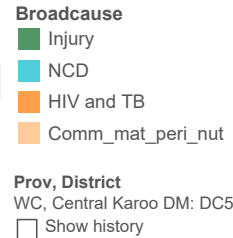

Percentage of deaths by broad cause and leading causes, 2012–2017

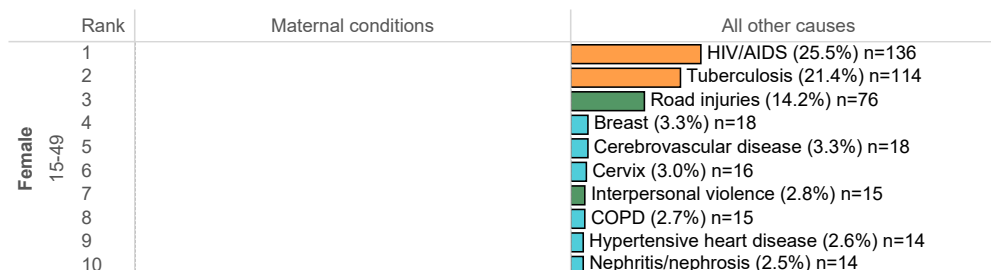
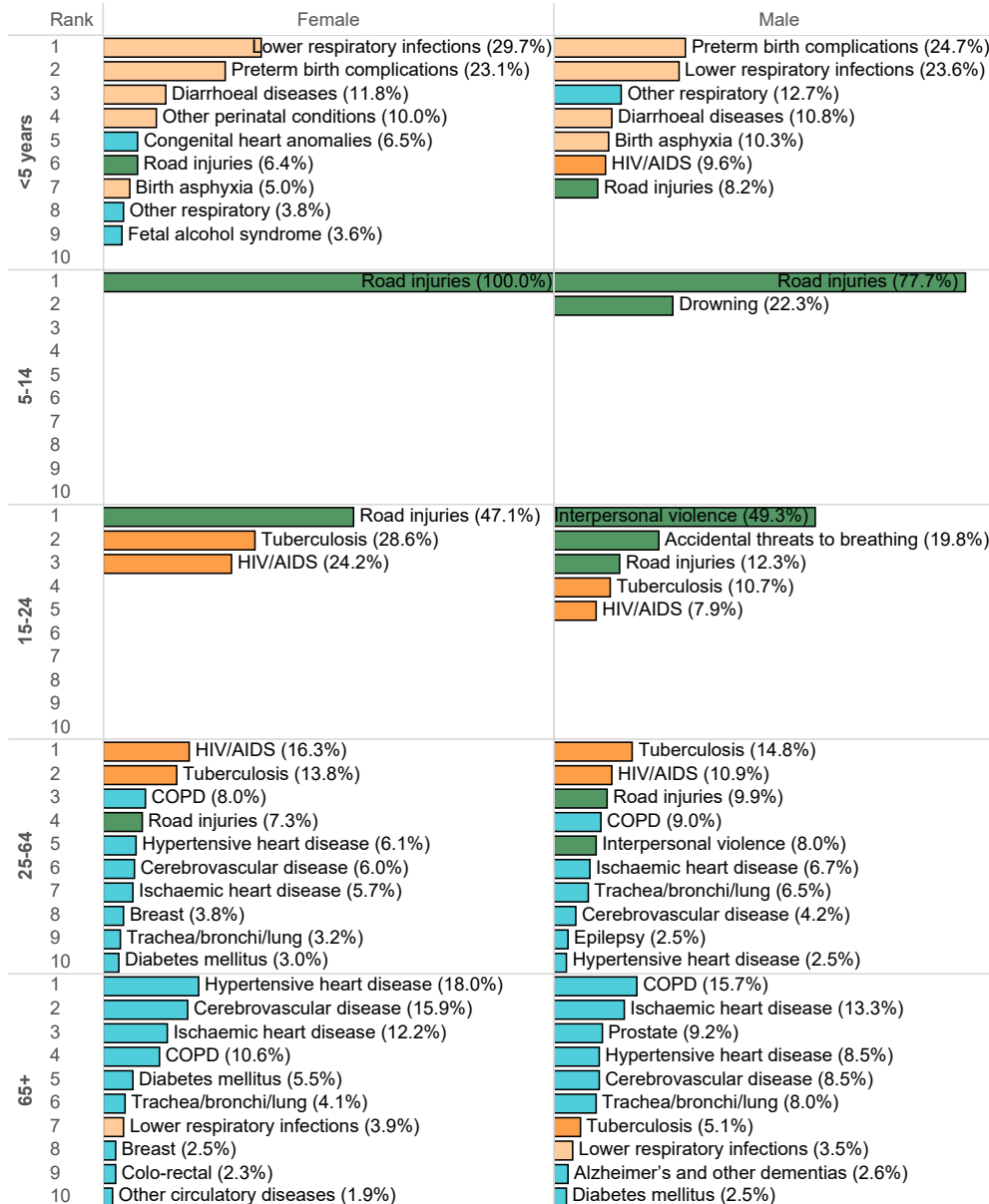

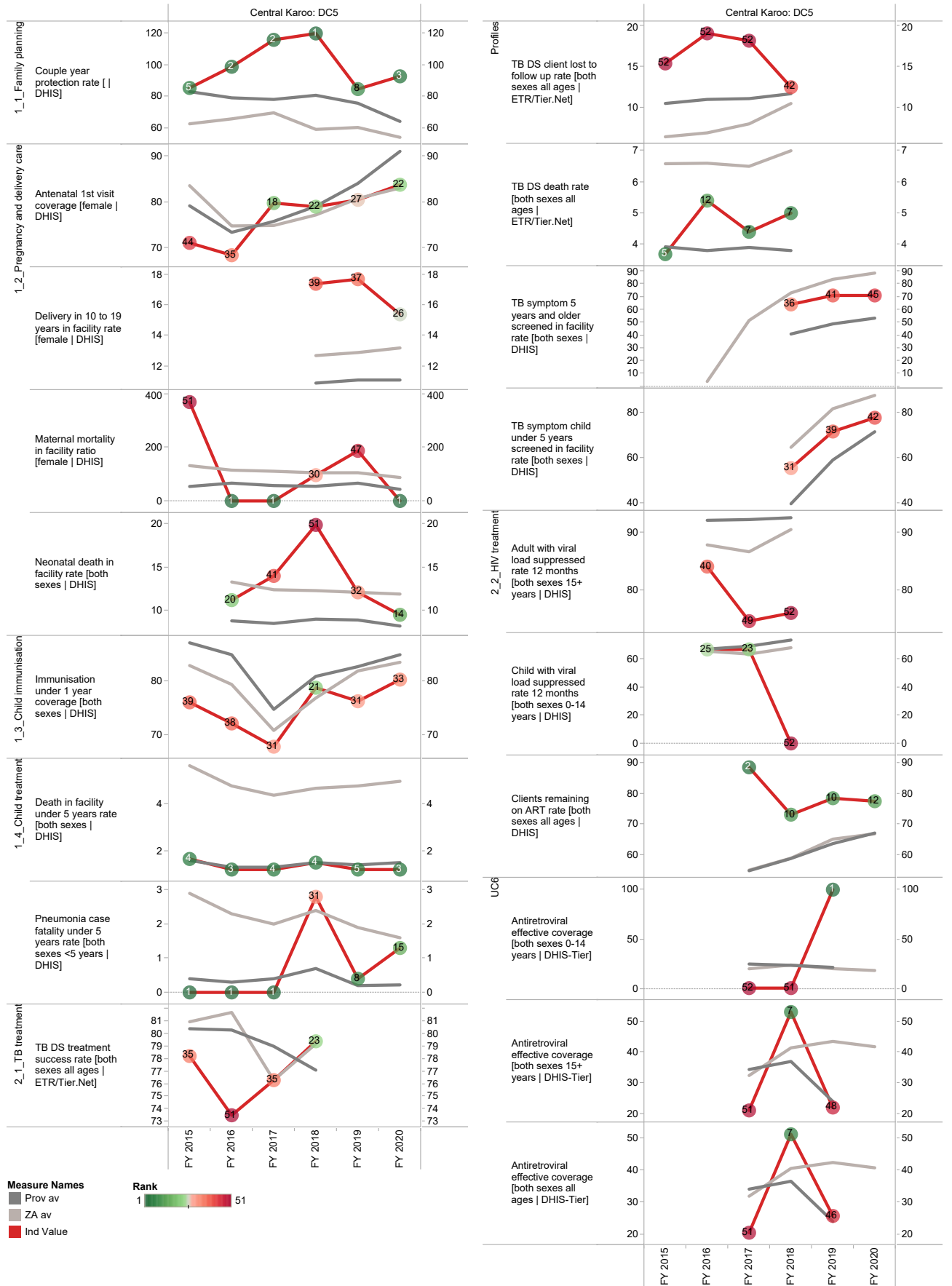
Percentage of deaths by broad causes and single leading causes
